A MESSAGE FROM OUR BOARD CHAIR

Twenty-five years!!! Let that sink in for a moment. For twenty-five years Comfort Zone has been helping guide children navigate their grief journeys. When Lynne and Kelly turned their dream into a reality in 1999, I'm not sure even they could have imagined that CZC would grow into the country's largest bereavement camp.

One of the best parts of having a long-standing history is that we have the privilege to watch children grow up to become incredible young adults, many of whom now volunteer as big buddies (or work at CZC). We have concrete proof that what we do at camp works!

A few highlights worth noting from 2024 - we hosted a record high 31 camps with kids attending from 33 different states. 1,428 children attended camp, and we also had 140 parents and guardians attend our family camps. We had 1,815 remarkable volunteers in 2024, many of whom have been volunteers for years. We expanded our footprint to South Carolina and Michigan (Lynne's home state, Go Spartan's) and increased our presence in Florida, California and Utah.

We continue to attract national attention through the media. This year, CZC was featured in the New York Times, Good Morning America, Fortune, Newsweek and Business Insider. Our social media presence has increased significantly and one of our posts (Trauma Salad) had over 24 million views, which increased the number of Instagram followers by over 12,000 people.

Most recently, we hosted galas in New York, Virginia and New Jersey, which led to record-breaking fundraising initiatives. All in all, our twenty-fifth year was our best one yet. On behalf of the CZC Board of Directors, THANK YOU to our hard-working staff, our dedicated volunteers, and all our friends who generously donate to ensure that we continue to meet our mission.

From what started as a small camp in Virginia has evolved into a national organization that has served over 25,000 children at no cost to the families.


